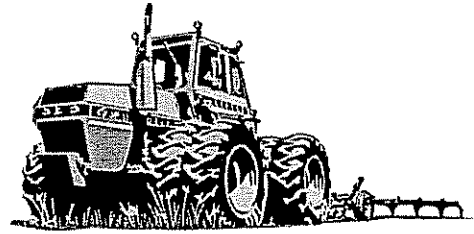


# Changes in Agriculture Through Time

## Possible Answers:

### Changes in Machinery

- Use tractors instead of horses

### Changes in Methods

- Contour plowing
- Use fertilizers, herbicides, pesticides and insecticides
- Provide animals medicine, vitamins and vaccines
- Provide animals with more nutritious feed, specific for their purpose
- Use hybrid seeds
- Use sophisticated watering systems that conserve water
- Use techniques that conserve/prevent soil erosion

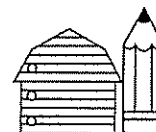
### Product Changes
